Dear Friends,

As you are all aware, Shaare Zedek remains in a period of intense activity relating to the Coronavirus and every indicator is that this is a reality we are forced to contend with for some time into the future.

Given that this is of course a global challenge, we must again begin by expressing our sincere wishes that all remains well with you and your families.

As we have reported in the past, Israel has a unique distinction as a country with a continued troublingly high rate of infection but a relatively low mortality rate (as compared to other countries.)

The flip-side of this positive trend is that it somewhat hides the incredible burden this pandemic is taking on our hospital. People may naturally look at the relatively low numbers of intubated patients and infer that the hospitals are not being inundated with patients. That is sadly not the case and it would be incorrect to underestimate the extent of this challenge.

A defining aspect of this second wave is that while it is very bad, it is not "bad enough" to require the closure of the remainder of our medical departments. Due to the fact that these departments remain open, our resources are stretched ever more thinly and the challenges only grow by the day. We are providing both Jerusalem residents, and patients from all over Israel alike, our usual top-quality medical care for a myriad of medical conditions. We are happy to share with you that 89 new babies came into the world at Shaare Zedek during the last 24 hours!

We continue to stand in awe at our medical and logistical staff on all levels for their continued unwavering efforts to provide the uncompromised care for which Shaare Zedek is so famous.

The endeavors made by the hospital management require many different elements and partnerships and certainly we are expecting that the Government of Israel will assume a part of this burden. These are events which were imposed upon all of us by factors well beyond our control and we, like all hospitals in Israel and the world over, have the legitimate expectation that governments will respond in kind.

Our focus is now on preparation for the coming months which we are forced to acknowledge will be extremely difficult ones.

We strongly believe that with the proper readiness and resources, these days of challenge will remain to be ones of pride for the greater Shaare Zedek community.
